Older Primes

We have started our first class project, Ants! In just two weeks, these are just some of the ant facts the class has learned and presented. Some are based on observation; some are based on researching in books! Some ants can fly!" "The queen lays 2,000 eggs every day." "Red ants bite and it can leave a bump on your skin." "There are over 20,000 different kinds of ants." "Ants have the largest brains of all insects." "There is an ant called the Zombie Ant." "Ants are easy to catch." "Ants are fast and strong." "Sometimes ants eat things that are bigger than them because some ants have poison in them."

Younger Primes

We have been quite excited to be starting our class outside this week. The main yard has been an instant hit with our class with some students experiencing this yard for the first time and others enjoying the remodel. We have been very busy beading and making jewelry, counting with an emphasis on 1:1 correspondence and exploring the alphabet. We are looking forward to beginning our math curriculum with the *Investigations* materials and starting our first project on Habitats.

Older All Days

Over the past month, the Older All Days class has been showing a lot of interest in animals and science, exploring these concepts both indoors and out. While indoors, they've spent quite a bit of time carefully studying pictures in the non-fiction book, *FISH*, experimenting with using bits of short lengths of drinking straws with play-dough to build interesting creations. While playing outside, they explored the Garden Yard, some children collecting acorns from the oak tree. Other children tried the monkey bars for the first time!
